Visa for marriage in Switzerland

(take up residence in Switzerland)

The information sheets for marriage in Switzerland are available here.

All required documents for the preparation of the marriage must first be submitted to the chancery of the Regional Consular Center in Bangkok during the <u>opening hours</u>. After completion of these formalities, the visa application to take up residency after marriage can be submitted to the visa section of the Regional Consular Center in Bangkok.

Documentary requirements

- Three <u>visa application form</u> ("Application for a long stay visa D")
 duly filled out, dated and signed by the applicant
- <u>Four passport-sized pictures</u>
 recently made color pictures, 3.5 4 cm in width, neutral light background, head takes up 70-80% of the surface
- Passport

valid at least three months after the planned entry date in the Schengen territory, at least two blank pages

- Two photocopies of the passport personal data page
- Criminal record

in English or French, original with two photocopies; the record can be ordered at the following address:

Fees

Here you can find the visa application-handling fee levied by the Regional Consular Center.

Procedure

The civil status documents will be forwarded by diplomatic courier to the civil registry office competent for the celebration of the marriage. The visa application will be submitted to the cantonal migration office competent for the Swiss partner's place of residence. The process may take several months. Information regarding the processing time will be given by the authorities in Switzerland only. In general, the Swiss partner is informed by the civil registry office as soon as the marriage can take place.

Once the authorization to enter Switzerland has been granted (form "Ermächtigung zur Visumerteilung" or "Autorisation habilitant les représentations Suisses à délivrer un visa"), the passport can be submitted to the Consular Agency in Phnom Penh by the applicant or by a third person during the <u>opening hours</u> without prior appointment. The passport will be sent to the Regional Consular Center in Bangkok by weekly courier <u>with postage fees</u> for the issuance of the visa and returned to Phnom Penh the following week. The exact pick up date of the passport will be communicated to the applicant by the Consular Agency in Phnom Penh.
