

## Checklist for Schengen Visa: Short-term stay for studies (less than 90 days)

Please submit the documents in the exact order given below, please do not staple any document.	✓
Visa application form:  ➤ Completed and signed by the applicant  ➤ The visa application form is free of charge and can be downloaded from the website:  https://www.sem.admin.ch/sem/en/home/themen/einreise/visumantragsformular.html	
<ul> <li>Important information for minors (under the age of 18)</li> <li>Both parents must sign the visa application form and the following additional documents are required: <ul> <li>a) The legalized birth certificate of the minor (containing both parents names). If the document is not in German, English, French or Italian, a translation by an official translator in one of those languages is needed.</li> <li>b) Copies of passports from both parents</li> <li>c) Consent letter of parents who do not travel with minor, certified by a Canadian authority.</li> <li>d) The relevant court documents, if only one parent has guardianship.</li> <li>e) Death certificate, if one of the parents passed away.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Valid national passport:</li> <li>➤ Your original passport valid at least three months beyond the intended stay, issued within the previous ten years. The passport must have at least two blank visa pages</li> </ul>	
A <b>photocopy of your passport</b> (photo, data and signature pages only).  If applicable, a copy of your previous Schengen visas, including related entry/exit stamps.	
One passport size picture:  > One loose passport color photo according to requirements.	
Proof of residency:  ➤ If you are not a Canadian citizen, a photocopy of your proof of residency in Canada (PR card, both sides copied on one sheet OR Canadian work or study permit and visa in your passport) valid for at least three months after the date of re-entry to Canada.	
Flight reservation:  A copy of your confirmed flight reservations / train tickets showing how you get to the Schengen area, travel around in the Schengen area and how you exit the Schengen area. The applicant's name and airline reservation / train ticket number must be visible	
<ul> <li>Travel Insurance:         <ul> <li>A confirmation that you hold sufficient travel insurance containing all of the following information:</li> <li>Your full name and duration of coverage</li> <li>The geographical coverage (usually "out of province" or "worldwide"): your coverage must be valid for all Schengen countries</li> <li>The covered amount must be a minimum of CAD 50'000 / Euro 30'000 for emergency medical expenses, hospital treatment and repatriation for medical reasons.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Generic information, such as policy descriptive or insurance booklets, is not accepted</li> </ul>	

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A A A A	A recent letter signed by your employer, confirming position, salary and continued employment after your return to Canada (work contract/offer is not accepted).  For self-employed, a registration or incorporation of your business, business license or business notice of articles showing your name.  For students, a confirmation of enrollment and a copy of the student card (both sides copied on one sheet).  For all others (retirees, pensioners etc.), documents proving ties in Canada, such as a property (copies of invoices and Property Tax Notice), investments, financial commitments (Notice of Assessment) in Canada as well as proof of family responsibilities.	
Course confirmation		
>	A confirmation of participation/registration to the course or seminar including confirmation of payment of any applicable fees.	
Proof of sufficient financial resources:		
>	A personal <b>Canadian bank</b> statement for the past three months, <b>showing your name</b> and all transactions on your account. A minimum of CAD 145 per day is required (CAD 50 for students).	
Pro	of of Accommodation:	
>	A hotel reservation (with a reservation number) or a confirmation of accommodation for the duration of your stay.	

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
