The following documents are required for registering your marriage with the Swiss authorities: Please note that the documents must be recent (issued within the past six months!)

1. Marriage Certificate

A complete and certified copy of a marriage certificate can usually be obtained from the county clerk's office where the marriage license was issued. The marital status at the time of marriage (single, divorced, widowed) and the names of the parents of both spouses should also be indicated on the marriage certificate.

2. Birth Certificate of Foreign Spouse

If your spouse was born in the U.S., a certified copy of his or her birth certificate, including the exact place of birth (city) and names of the parents. This document is issued by the Department of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics, of the place of birth, or by the Department of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics, in the capital of the state where the person was born. Please ask for a complete and certified copy of the birth certificate, which must show the place (municipality) of birth and the parents' full names, including the maiden name of the mother.

Other foreign civil status documents must be legalized by the Swiss diplomatic or consular representation responsible for the country of origin. The requirements are very different from one country to the other. To find out which documents will have to be submitted, consult the webpage of the responsible Swiss representation or ask your Swiss representation in the United States.

3. If your spouse was <u>previously married</u>, please also submit a complete and certified copy of his or her <u>divorce</u> <u>decree</u> or, if the spouse was previously deceased, a copy of the <u>death certificate</u>.

Divorce Decree

To obtain a certified copy of a final and absolute divorce decree (indicating "date filed/entered…"), a request should be made to the court clerk of the court which granted the divorce.

Death Certificate

This document is issued by the Department of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics, of the place of death, or by the Department of Health, Bureau of Vital Statistics, in the capital of the state where the death occurred. Please ask for a complete and certified copy of the death certificate, which must show the parents' names, including the maiden name of the mother.

IMPORTANT

- 1. All documents (originals or certified copies) must bear the official seal. Documents issued by hospitals and churches and documents legalized by a notary public <u>cannot</u> <u>be accepted</u> by the competent Swiss authorities!
- 2. The documents submitted to this Embassy will not be returned. They will be translated, legalized and sent to Switzerland.
