## The following documents are required for registering your divorce with the Swiss authorities:

- > Certified original copy of the final divorce decree, with the decree showing the exact date when the judgment entered into effect (filing date).
- Custody order for minor children, if applicable
  - Certified copies of final and absolute divorce decrees may be requested from the court clerk of the court that granted the divorce.

## **IMPORTANT**

- 1. Documents certified by a notary public will not be accepted.
- 2. The documents must be certified by the issuing authority no more than 6 months before they are sent for registration.
- 3. The documents submitted to the Swiss representation will not be returned. They will be translated, legalized and sent to Switzerland.
