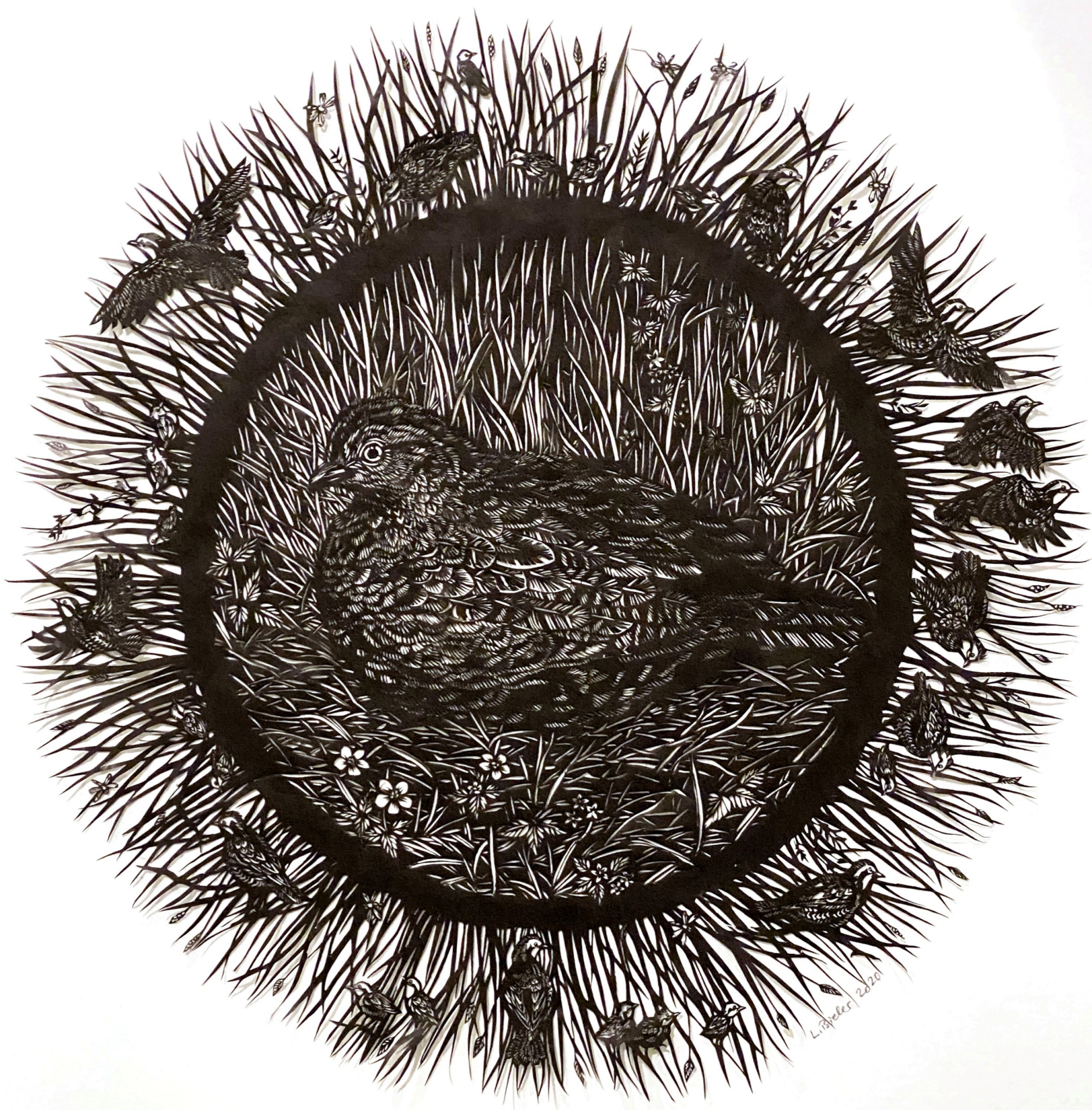
Swiss Night at DC United vs. Chicago Fire
