> Notification to the Signatory and Acceding States to the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES), concluded in Washington on 3 March 1973

Accession by the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

On 12 March 1996, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia deposited with the Swiss Government an instrument of accession to the CITES and made a reservation concerning the following species listed in the Annex I of the Convention (original text):

Vultur gryphus

Accipitridae Aquila adalberti (also referenced as Aquila heliaca adalberti)

According to its article XXII, paragraph 2, the Convention, amended in Bonn on 22 June 1979, will enter into force for the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia 90 days after the deposit of the instrument of accession, i.e. on 10 June 1996.

The present notification is addressed to the Governments of the Signatory and Acceding States in conformity with article XXV, paragraph 2, of the CITES.
