## Children - Exception to rule requiring to live in the same household as the principal beneficiary (studies abroad)

To be returned to the Swiss Mission

## Reminder of the rules and conditions under the **Guidelines**

Unmarried children under the age of 25 are allowed to enter Switzerland on the grounds of family reunification and are issued with the same type of legitimation card as the principal beneficiary. They must live in the same household as the principal beneficiary. An exception to this rule can however be made if children are studying abroad.

When a mission/delegation requests a legitimation card for such a child, it must inform in writing the Swiss Mission in what country and city the child is studying and how long their studies are likely to take. If the child subsequently moves in with the principal beneficiary, the mission/delegation must inform in writing the Swiss Mission. The same rule applies to children who are living in the same household as the principal beneficiary and subsequently move abroad for purposes of study.
