STATEMENT BY SWITZERLAND

Mr. Chair,

We thank the Director General for his report on Verification and Monitoring in the Islamic Republic of Iran in light of United Nations Security Council resolution 2231 (2015). We also thank DDG Aparo for the technical briefing.

Switzerland once again expresses its disappointment that an agreement to return to the full implementation of the JCPOA by all parties continues to remain elusive. The preservation of the JCPOA remains a crucial element in the global nuclear non-proliferation regime and international security architecture. We call on all parties to redouble their efforts to conclude an agreement despite adverse conditions, as the non-proliferation benefits of the JCPOA continue to erode, as illustrated by the continuous and significant increases in Iran's stockpile of various levels of enriched uranium.

Mr. Chair,

Switzerland has repeatedly expressed its regret over the withdrawal from the JCPOA and the re-imposition of sanctions by the United States. We also once again express our concern over the different steps taken by Iran which are inconsistent with its nuclear-related commitments and significantly exceed JCPOA limits.

We remain deeply concerned about Iran's continuously increasing overall stockpiles of 5%, 20% and particularly 60% enriched uranium as well as the ongoing installation of new centrifuge infrastructure. We take note of yet another down-blending campaign of 60% enriched uranium.

Iran's continued suspension of the provisional application of its Additional Protocol and its non-implementation of other JCPOA-related transparency measures, have seriously impacted the Agency's ability to verify that Iran's activities are exclusively of civilian nature. Consequently, the Agency has lost continuity of knowledge in relation to the production and inventory of relevant items.

Moreover, we are troubled by the fact that virtually any progress in the implementation of any of the three elements of the Joint Statement of 4 March 2023 has been absent for more than a year despite the efforts by the Director General to operationalize the Agreement. The activities and measures, as agreed in the Joint Statement, need to be implemented without further delay.

Mr. Chair,

We welcome the Director General's continued and tireless efforts with regard to the Agency's JCPOA-related verification and monitoring role. We have full confidence in the independent, impartial and professional manner in which the Agency fulfils its mandate. We remind Iran that full and timely cooperation with the IAEA is indispensable for establishing trust in the peaceful and civilian nature of Iran's nuclear activities.
